2022 in Review

2022 has been the biggest and best...and the busiest year for Redeemed Steel yet!

We started the year by training pastors and leasders in Costa Rica followed by the countries first ever Hammer in with 40-50 local craftsmen. This wil become an annual even sponsored by those same craftsmen and used to share the gospel and the trade in their country.

We travelled to Virginia and to Colorado with our partners at Zoweh, ministering to hundreds of men, sharing the story of Redeemed Steel and how God reshapes our hearts to make us into the beautiful and useful works of art he always intended us to be.

We conducted our 4th annual Hammer In in North Carolina, sharing the gospel with hundreds of people and raising over 10k for our trade school mission in Guatemala.

Let's talk about that for a moment. As a result of our mission in Costa Rica and our ongoing work in Guatemala, God has given us a vision to begin building trade schools all over the world. The first of these will be in Guatemala. God has provided the land, and we are almost halfway to our fundraising goal of sixty thousand dollars to build it. We already have many of the tools we will need and teachers ready to volunteer once the school is built. Our goal is to have 250 people give 20 dollars a month. If we can reach this goal, we can build a school every year! We've still got a long way to go before we reach that number. Would you please consider joining us in this?

On faith, we've already broken ground on that school and progress is being made already. We are hoping to complete it's construction in 2023-2024.

We traveleed to Montana and partnered with The New Frontiers Ministry, a natural fit for our passion for helpiing families.

We travelled back to Guatemala where we built a house, (we've built six in the past 2 years) and fed a village of 500 people with enough food for 2 weeks. There is so much work to do there, and we are so proud to partner with His Works and Global Action Ministies as well as Servant's Heart ministries in all they are doing

To wrap up the year, we travelled to Alabama to teach a weeks worth of classes for Forging a Difference and participate in their annual Grudge Match.

That's not to mention the other events such as Travis Leblanc's Hammer in and others.

We currently have about 20 people of our 250 goal committed to giving 20 a month. That number might seem small, but that's 20 people who share the vision and mission of Redeemed Steel. Let's not forget that Christ started the New Testament church with 12!

We are committed to making this school the fist of many. We have serveral of the tools ready to go the moment the work is finished. And, we have teachers ready and willing to serve.

What's more, we have so many opportunties to serve becoming available. We currently have 4-5 other countries already asking us to come build and serve.

Our priority is to first finish the school in Guatemala and then begin in other countries, but while they wait, we hope to bring folks to the US to train them so that they can lay the groundwork for our effort in those countries.

We currently have missions planned in Guatemela, Costa Rica, and all over the US on the calendar. Demand is high and we still have room to add even more trips to serve. There's plenty of work to do, so there's no chance we're going to run out.
